To the Members of the Board of Supervisors,

The members of the San Francisco Veteran Police Officers Association, Inc. (SFVPOA), in a unanimous vote, have resolved that they do not want the San Francisco Employees Retirement System (ERS) Board, or the Retirement Trust Fund, tampered with in any way by the elected officials of the City and County of San Francisco (CCSF).
